On our search for funding our tree-planting projects, we came across an "Open Call" from the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs as part of the International Cultural Policy for cultural activities in Morocco. This "Open Call" temporarily provides funding for Dutch Moroccan partner projects. So, we decided to apply without having ever applied for something like this before. After having filled out the required documents we waited patiently.



But unfortunately, we received notice that we were not accepted. It was a good experience for us, and it led us to the next step in our search for funding: FINDNFUND. <u>FindNFund</u> is a charity platform for Finders & Funders which helps connect social enterprises that are committed to helping others.

Great news via FINDNFUND

After making a profile for Stichting Sahara-Roots we completed the application forms for a tree planting project which would start during the Zamane festival in November 2025. We received great news from FINDNFUND: "Congratulations! Stichting de Hoorn has awarded you €8,000 for the project "Tree planting activities using the Dutch invention "Groasis Waterboxx" during the Zamane Festivals 2025, 2026 & 2027"!

Funder De Hoorn: "A wonderful project that has been running for many years and is well-managed and monitored." We as Finders are grateful for the funding that we received from Stichting de Hoorn which enabled us to buy 200 Groasis waterboxx's and ship them to Morocco!

2025 ZAMANE FESTIVAL

On 14th of November 2025 the official opening ceremony of the 4th edition of the <u>Zamane Festival</u> in Mhamid took place. The entrance to the <u>Joudour Sahara</u> grounds had become greener but unfortunately it quickly became clear that our buildings were not yet finished. After all the handshaking with the contractor last April we had high hopes, but we were disappointed. However, even though the amphitheater is not quite finished, concerts could take place here and we heard from Thomas Duncan from our partner <u>Playing for Change</u> (PfC), that the acoustics are great and that there have already been music workshops recorded in the past weeks.

Together with many visitors, local and international musicians such as <u>Luke Winslow King</u>, <u>Aziz Sahmaoui</u> and <u>Vieux Farka Toure</u>, and boardmembers & sponsors of PfC who had flown in from the US, we enjoyed the different styles of music during the 3-day concerts given in the Joudour Sahara Amphitheater with beautiful sand dunes as a backdrop!

As the sun set over the sand dunes, the concerts shifted to the main stage in M'hamid which allowed the locals to also enjoy the concerts given 3 nights in a row.





Checking plots & tree-planting!

15 November: time to check our tree-planting plots, especially the fruit trees planted by the IYOGA group last February. We found that 50% had not survived the long hot summer although they were planted in the Groasis waterboxx's. We talked about the problems with our tree caretaker and once again explained how to work with this system. Together with Abdelqadir & Habib we started replanting the trees lost and on the positive side we have discovered which fruit trees can handle the heat as well as the "salty" conditions of the soil.

16 November: planting day the Sahara-roots team helped prepare the tree-planting area together with Abdelqadir. We planted palm trees in waterboxx's and it was the honour to invite the cofounder of Playing for Change, Whitney Kroenke Silverstein, to plant the 1st tree after which all PfC visitors & musicians where able to join in.





Building a positive change for others to follow!

17 November: on our last day in M'hamid, we continued tree-planting, in quiet on the Joudour Sahara site. It is becoming greener although we still lose many trees & plants to the heat of summer. But we remain positive as every tree that survives is a miracle in this hot, dry and fragile environment! We hope that with a "grassroots" approach, others will follow our example for a better tomorrow!
